Department of Economic and Community Development



Over the last 16 years, the New Britain Museum of American Art has been transformed into a world class cultural institution through the artistic vision and inspirational leadership of our Director, Douglas Hyland. During Douglas' tenure, the Museum's endowment has more than doubled; attendance has more than tripled; the already excellent collection has increased fourfold; and the physical space has multiplied by a factor of five. Although Douglas announced his retirement at last year's Annual Meeting, it is a testament to his discipline and energy that much has been accomplished in 2015.

One of the highlights of 2015 has been the construction of the Art & Education Building, the focus of the Museum's attention for the last three years. The 18,000 sq. ft. addition will open officially on October 17, 2015. As a result of gaining 40% more space, for the last year we have been planning the installation of the permanent collection in the new galleries and the complete rehanging of the existing galleries in the Chase Family Building. The Education Department also has ambitious plans for the use of the three spacious studios on the lower level.

As always, the Museum has offered hundreds of different activities for the enjoyment and education of a broad range of different constituencies from babies in arms to senior citizens. Our activities have centered around our encyclopedic collection and also enhanced the experience of visitors to the major changing exhibitions of the year: Glass Today: 21st Century Innovations, Let Me Quilt One More Day, Over Life's Waters: The Coastal Collection of Charles and Irene Hamm, and The Enchanting Jewels of Elizabeth Gage.

We are especially grateful to and honored by the generous gift of the Hamm Collection to the Museum. As a result, the Museum will house one of the largest and most comprehensive collections of outstanding American 19th and 20th century coastal artists. While a few of the artists were in our collection already, the vast majority were not, allowing us to expand our understanding in a way that would have been impossible to contemplate without the Hamms.

Each exhibition has commanded sizeable attendance and at the same time we are pleased to attract specific aficionados of glass, textiles, marine paintings, and jewelry. We have never organized a quilt show before and we are most thankful to the dozens of lenders including leading museums and a distinguished group of contemporary quilters. Similarly, the jewelry show was a first for the Museum and it was a pleasure displaying over 150 examples by Elizabeth Gage, who is a charming, creative artist. We are proud to have celebrated 50 years of her life as an internationally acclaimed designer. Sponsored by the Bank of America, f. 64: Revolutionary Vision consisted of a survey of 40 of the most iconic images by the most renowned photographers of the 20th century. Photography is increasingly popular at the Museum and this exhibition allowed us to present extraordinary images of great rarity.

Our NEW/NOW artists are both innovators and entertainers. Bob Gregson, Titus Kaphar, Karl Lund, and Katja Loher are four very different artists. At the same time, they are able to expand our appreciation of the role of artists in the 21st century. We are pleased that significant examples by all four of these creative individuals will be shown at the Museum for many years to come as part of the permanent collection. John O'Donnell's *Psychedelic Pantry* and Catherine Ross' *Laugh Track* have served as our New Media artists of 2014–2015. This ever popular section of the Batchelor Gallery is appreciated by our more than 12,000 school children as well as our visitors interested in contemporary art.

Traditionally, the Davis Gallery shows have allowed the Museum to spotlight 19th and 20th century artists of a more traditional bent. Cary Smith curated a survey of nonobjective artists and assembled an intriguing group of paintings by more than 20 of his friends and colleagues. Arguably, Nelson Augustus Moore was the most





significant painter/photographer of 19th century New Britain and we are pleased to have displayed the collection of Todd and Marenda Stitzer. In the Warrington Gallery, we celebrated the achievements of Otis Kaye, a brilliant painter of money and a master of the trompe l'oeil tradition. The comprehensive catalog which accompanied the exhibition has documented his achievements most thoroughly. We were struck recently when a woman visited the Tom Yost exhibition and shared that his paintings of the Litchfield Hills brought tears to her eyes. It is encouraging to know that in the 21st century, Connecticut landscapes can evoke such a powerful response.

Over the last several years, the number and quality of the entries to the Museum's Annual Juried Exhibition has increased dramatically and we were delighted that over 250 artists submitted their work for consideration. The result was a powerful survey featuring more than IOO paintings, mixed media creations, photographs, watercolors, drawings, and sculptures.

Over 500 works of art were added to the permanent collection. Among the highlights of the year were Andrew Erdos' Cheerfully Rooting through Ruby Red Detritus, 2013, Deborah Moore's Pink Lady Slipper-Gigantica II, 2012 and Charles Ethan Porter's Peonies, c. 1885 purchased through the Museum's acquisition endowment. As we prepare to display hundreds of more works of art, we have had dozens of paintings conserved and reframed so that they will be in better condition and more attractively presented than ever before.

Once again, the Museum's Art of Wine & Food and Gala were highly successful and generated more money than ever before to help defray the operating expenses of the Museum. John Dillaway and his committee of wine enthusiasts raised over \$122,800 in the fall and Gala Chairman Kathryn Cox raised \$205,400 in the spring at the annual Museum gala, The Art Party of the Year.

We are very fortunate to have such a stable group of employees. Director of Development Claudia Thesing has worked at the Museum for more than twenty-five years; Director of Education Linda Mare fifteen years; Director of Visitors Services Melanie Carr nine years; and Director of Finance Tom Bell six years. It is a pleasure to work with such professional and congenial colleagues. John Urgo, who performed innumerable tasks and was responsible for so many beautifully installed exhibitions, resigned from the staff and we wish him every success. We are fortunate to have his colleague Keith Gervase assume the mantle of his responsibilities and we hired our first Registrar in many years, Stacy Cerullo. Already this dynamic duo has made enormous strides in Collections as more works of art are documented than ever before. Emily Misencik has been enormously helpful in organizing a wide variety of different exhibitions, acquisitions, and programs. Of course, the entire staff played a pivotal role in all of our successes.

At the Annual Meeting, October 22, 2014, longtime Trustees Ken Carifa and John Patrick rotated off after three, three-year terms. After serving longer than any other Trustee in recent memory, former Chairman John Rathgeber also left the Board. All three Trustees were named Trustee Emeriti as was Howard Fromson. Kay Knight Clarke and Paula Viscogliosi were elected to the Board.

We wish to express gratitude to all the trustees, but especially to the members of the Executive Committee, Barbara Bradbury-Pape, Chairman of the Long Range Planning Committee, Steve Miller and Anita Ferrante, Chairmen of the Acquisition and Loan Committee, Paula Viscogliosi, Chairman of the Education Committee, John Dillaway, Chairman of the Personnel Committee, Ken Boudreau, Chairman of the Finance Committee, John Howard, Chairman of the Investment Committee, Tom Flanigan, Chairman of the Development Committee, Kathryn Cox, Chairman of the Nominating Committee, Trustee Emertus Lindsley Wellman, Chairman of the Low Illustration Committee, and David Jepson, Chairman of the Buildings and Grounds Committee and also Chairman of the Building Committee. In particular, David Jepson has attended dozens of meetings and has done an outstanding job of supervising the new building. We are fortunate to have employed Downes & Co. since the 1930s and each and every one of their additions and renovations has been built on budget, on time, and with consistent quality and endurance.

People enjoy the New Britain Museum of American Art in large part because of the success of the design of the Chase Family Building and with the new addition we expect an even larger attendance. Ann Beha and Steven Gerrard of Ann Beha Architects have designed a cheerful structure, which is perfectly suited for its purposes.

A larger group of firm supporters of the Museum died last year than in previous years ever before. It includes long-term members, volunteers, artists, and patrons. Walt Reed, Honorary Trustee, served on the Low Illustration Committee for over fifty years. He was responsible for the gift of hundreds of illustrations to the Low Collection. As one of the country's leading authorities on American illustrations, he helped guide the Museum and proved a steadfast supporter. Not only that, but he was a kind, gentle, thoughtful man. Thomas R. Cox III was the co-founder with his wife Kathryn of the John Butler Talcott Society, served as the Chairman of the Art of Wine and Food, and was a generous patron and good friend. Mary Clapp, Carol Kreeger Davidson, Norm Erickson, Connie Granski, June Mitchell, Rosalind Richman, and Elizabeth Young, along with many others will be greatly missed by the Museum family.

As noted above at last year's Annual Meeting, Douglas announced his planned retirement in the fall of 2015 after 16 years at the helm. During his tenure, the building has been transformed and the collections vastly improved. The appreciation for the Museum has grown dramatically and we now boast of attendance exceeding 100,000 visitors per year. Parts of the collection are on display for the appreciation of visitors in over 15 locations in Hartford County. Last year, the Museum organized over 1,000 programs and activities. The Board of Trustees, staff, and members wish him every future success and thank him for his leadership and vision since he took over as Museum Director in October 1999.

During the ensuing year, a Search Committee was formed, chaired by Todd Stitzer and comprised of seven other Trustees and stakeholders with a distinguished and diverse array of experience: Ken Boudreau, Kay Cox, Anita Ferrante, John Howard, John Rathgeber, Melinda Sullivan, and Kathryn West. For the national search, the Committee retained Marilyn Hoffman of Museum Search & Reference, an executive-search firm located in Manchester, NH and Boston. A strong field of candidates emerged with semi-finalist and finalist interviews schedule for early summer. A recommendation by the Search Committee for the sixth director of the NBMAA, Min Jung Kim, was approved by the Board of Trustees and announced in August. Kim brings more than 20 years of experience in the art museum field and was most recently the Deputy Director for External Relations at the Eli and Edythe Broad Art Museum at Michigan State University in East Lansing, Michigan. Previously, Kim worked at the Solomon R. Guggenheim Foundation, New York for more than 12 years, focusing on a variety of international alliances and collaborative initiatives.

We all look forward to the coming year when we have the use of the new building and our visitors will have an opportunity to experience many more objects from the permanent collection than have ever been displayed before in our III year history.

EDUCATION PROGRAMS ENGAGING ACCESSIBLE PROGRAMMING FOR ALL AGES

To meet the demand of our varied audience, the Museum offered a wide range of educational programs for people of all ages. These included lectures, gallery talks, studio classes and workshops, film, music, theater, art and literature programs, guided tours for children and adults, outreach programs, and professional development services for teachers. These programs offer visitors of all ages and backgrounds opportunities for lifelong learning in the arts while strengthening the Museum's education mission. At the same time they employ a vast number of artists, educators, art historians and other professionals contributing to the cultural fabric of the region. As stated in the Director's report the education department has been

planning and revamping programs in preparation for the opening of the new Art & Education Building. With more galleries and studio spaces education staff is preparing to unveil new and exciting offerings for the public.

Our Nurture through Art: Infant to Teen initiative offers age-appropriate programming for children, youth, and families in the stimulating and unique setting of the NBMAA. The education department focused on building and strengthening a creative and enthusiastic children and family audience, and will continue to offer engaging and diverse programming in the future. Arts programming is known to enhance children's appreciation of art, stir creativity and critical thinking, advance cognitive, emotional and social health and provide a strong foundation for intellectual growth.

Highlights of the year included strong demand for student tours with record funding in support of our Access to the Arts program providing tour and art experiences for specific school districts. During FY15, 8,294 students were on tour accompanied by 1,156 teachers and adult chaperones, from over 80 cities and towns. That represented 728 docent-led tours, many followed by a related art activity in the American Savings Foundation Art Studio. Adult tours numbered 2,561 representing an additional 292 docent-led tours. The NBMAA docent corps now numbers 118 with eight graduates completing a rigorous eight-month training program. The Museum recognizes the important role docents play in serving the community in the field of art education.

For the 25th year the Museum hosted, with support from Webster Bank, Art from the New Britain Public and Parochial Schools which featured artwork from 230 students in grades K–I2 with nearly 700 people attending the opening reception. The 5th annual Berlin Public Schools: Student Art Exhibition featured 215 works from students in grades K–I2 with nearly 600 people attending the opening reception. Additionally, the Museum hosted, with support from The Elizabeth Norton Trust Fund and the Plainville Community Fund at the Main Street Community Foundation, Art from the Plainville Community Schools which featured nearly 200 works by Plainville students K–I2, with nearly 500 people attending the opening reception.

Adult programming throughout the year was strong. Participation numbered over 8,000 visitors who attended Day of Learning programs, lectures, gallery talks, studio experiences, tours, music, and film. These events are all listed in the Programming for Adults section of this report and I hope it encourages you to join us for a program soon.

THE VISITOR EXPERIENCE

If you have visited the Museum once or over a hundred times, you passed through the Front Desk which is quite the hub of activity. The Visitor & Volunteer Services staff guarantees the cheerful welcome that you are accustomed to receiving as you enter the Vance Lobby, serving as the Museum's initial impression and delivering vital information to visitors. If there is a question, we've got an answer. The multifaceted department includes the Front Desk, Museum Shop, a thriving and growing Volunteer and Internship Program, Café on the Park (operated by Riverhouse Catering), Facility Rentals, outreach initiatives and a series of growing public programs and events.

This year the Front Desk staff greeted over 90,000 American art loving visitors from all over the country, with the exception of Idaho, Kansas, South Dakota and Mississippi. Globe-trotting visitors include folks from Australia, Canada, France, Germany, Israel, Italy, Poland, Russia and the United Kingdom. It's always exciting to see where visitors come from—there is no greater privilege than to provide a positive and meaningful experience to all our guests who come from all over the world.

The Volunteer and Internship Program is a continuous lifeline to the successful operation of our day to day functions. Our 425 volunteers devote a considerable amount of time to our mission and are very much part of our culture as an institution. The Volunteer Council, which acts as a forum to open dialog between the larger Volunteer Corps and the Museum's Staff, holds quarterly meetings to ensure this important part of our framework is fully operational and successful. Additionally, we host monthly volunteer training sessions in an effort to recruit new volunteers in a welcoming and informative environment.

Community Outreach initiatives were robust this year and especially noteworthy was the reinstituted Multicultural Audience Development Focus Group. Museum staff met with members of the community to discuss and strategize how the Museum can continue to build an audience reflective of the fabric of the community at large. We were pleased to be featured on Noticias18, an affiliate of Spanish language TV Network, Entravision Communications, in an effort to more deeply engage with the Spanish speaking community. In total, our outreach efforts allowed us to engage with 7,893 people as a result of offsite activities that range from participation in Baseball in Education Days at New Britain Stadium, home of the Rock Cats, Elizabeth Park's Rose Garden Festival, and as a destination tour site of CT Main Street's 2015 Awards Gala. Additionally, our Pop-up Market, every fourth Saturday of the month, May to September, happens outside the museum walls, on one of our terraces, and is a way to attract members from the very active Walnut Hill Park area to the Museum.

VISITOR SERVICES

The Museum Shop had an exciting year with a host of new initiatives to enhance your shop experiences. In January, we launched a newly redesigned Web Store which features collection related merchandise and amazing one-of-a-kind artisanal products. Additionally, we launched a survey and customer testimonial program to get direct feedback so we can continue to provide the best service and merchandise. The most profitable departments of fiscal year 2015 were Consignment Artists, Jewelry, and NBMAA branded merchandise. Overall sales for the FY15 were \$183,365.75. We saw a 14% increase in our holiday department merchandise and an increase of 59% in jewelry sales.

In areas of product development, the Museum Shop made great strides and now offers a variety of merchandise, magnets, journals, mugs, matted prints and more from our beloved Pulp Art Collection, Thomas Hart Benton's The Arts of Life in America and our popular black and white Where Art Meets Life line featuring tote bags, caps, t-shirts, and more. Most notably, we commissioned a line of ceramics by artist Nicole Aquillano featuring a beautiful image of the Museum. We also expanded our post card offerings and will continue to bring more images of the collection to your home. Maker's Market: Holiday Edition featured 25 local artists and provided a festive tone for our December 2014 First Friday.

Other areas of programming that remain a staple Museum experience include Museum After Dark, First Friday, and our 2nd Annual Craft Sippin' in New Britain. The Museum hosted 3,688 attendees for our MAD parties and another 3,568 at our newly refreshed First Friday events, which are

held monthly and have been going strong since 1995. Craft Sippin', our collaboration with Hartford Distributers and 19 craft beer vendors, was a huge success as 573 beer enthusiasts enjoyed the tasting event in our galleries. There is always something new and exciting happening!

Our partnership with the dynamic Riverhouse Catering has proven successful. The Museum remains a top venue for special events and private functions, with 74 internal and external private events totaling 3,618 guests in attendance. Café on the Park serves delicious food seven days a week, and this year processed over 21,000 meal transactions—making the Café a delicious and bustling part of the overall visitor experience.

FINANCE

Financial results for FY15 proved positive, especially in the context of the major capital expansion underway, scheduled for completion in October 2015. The year ended with a balanced budget and a \$5,822,157 growth in net assets. Auditors CohnReznick LLP issued an unmodified audit opinion for FY15.

OPERATING RESULTS

The year ended with a balanced operating budget. Contributed and Earned Income came in better than budget, while expenses were \$82,251 higher than budget, in part due to unanticipated Director's Search expenses and grant-funded publication costs. Support from the Museum's endowments for operations totaled \$754,508 representing a 4.98% draw off a trailing I2-quarter average market value compared to a budgeted figure of \$791,591 or 5.22% due to the net gain in income over budget.

Looking forward the board passed the FY16 budget recommended by the Finance Committee, including assumptions regarding the impact on both income and expenses of operating the additional spaces of the new building—seven new galleries and three art studios.

An additional \$291,942 was spent on collection acquisition and conservation funded by a FY15 draw of \$279,037 on funds earmarked for acquisition, and \$12,905 in proceeds from deaccessioned artwork and donations for purchase.

CAPITAL PROJECTS

Construction continued in earnest on the Museum's Art & Education new 17,346 sq. ft. building. Through June 30th, \$7,761,038 was spent on construction. A line of credit was established with Webster Bank, prime minus 1%.


Fundraising for the three-pronged project including endowment growth, property purchase, additional parking lots and the 17,346 sq. ft. addition was strong with \$2,794,479 raised in FY15 for a total of \$18,274,433.

STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL POSITION

Net assets totaled \$48,643,592 at June 30, 2015, an increase of \$5,822,157 due to investment gains, contributions, primarily to the capital campaign. The Museum had \$23,111,224 in liquid assets. Liabilities increased by \$2,061.46 to \$2,662,760, also related to the construction project.

DEVELOPMENT DETAILS MEMBERSHIP

The NBMAA's membership program, the largest revenue producer at \$539,231, continued to expand ending the year with 4,055 memberships or 5,954 members.

American Art Circle and John Butler Talcott Society Events For our premier level members (donors at the \$1,000 level and above) we hosted special exhibition previews and receptions with the artist, collector or curator in advance of the public opening. In FY15 we visited the Collinsville artist studios of Joe Fig and Cary Smith, toured two lovely gardens in Litchfield, visited artist Martin Kline's studio and new gallery in bucolic Rhinebeck, NY, and viewed the collection of Chris and Jan Larsen in their home in Bloomfield. The Annual Black Tie Director's Dinner for John Butler Talcott Society members at the \$2,500 level and up was held April II, 2015. Fifty people attended the elegant affair. Both of these groups are enthusiastically chaired by Tom and Kay Cox.

Circle Level Members

(Donors of \$100-\$500) were invited to their own private reception and viewing of the four major exhibitions. Three New Member Behind the Scenes Tours proved popular.

Heritage Society

A champagne brunch was held for Heritage Society members Apr. 18, 2015 with an update on the expansion by Director Douglas Hyland. The group now numbers 84 and includes people who have indicated their intention to remember the NBMAA in their estate plans with cash gifts, charitable gift annuities, artwork or other planned gifts.

The Museum's Travel Program brought NBMAA members and guests to Belgium (by barge) and Berlin, Potsdam and Dresden Germany. Also, Museum members traveled by bus to several stops in New York including MOMA, the

New York Botanical Garden, and the Bronx Museum of the Arts. These trips, organized by International Barging Tours, Friendship Tours and TravelBuilders International, generated a total of \$22,115 in revenue for the NBMAA.

GIFTS AND GRANTS TO OPERATIONS

The Annual Fund was supported with gifts totaling \$123,661. Special gifts and grants from individuals, corporations, foundations and government agencies were particularly strong and totaled \$597,451, over \$50,000 over goal. We remain grateful for annual gifts in support of Museum's education programs, exhibitions and operations from American Savings Foundation and the Community Foundation of Greater New Britain. The NBMAA was once again the beneficiary of operating grants from the Greater Hartford Arts Council, funded in part by donors to the Greater Hartford Arts Council United Arts Campaign and the City of New Britain through a grant from the Department of Economic and Community Development (DECD). We also are grateful for the generosity of many area corporations including Farmington Bank, presenting sponsor of The Art of Wine & Food; Webster Bank, presenting sponsor of the Spring Gala and children's annual art exhibition; and Stanley Black & Decker, general operating support.

This year the Museum benefited from a Direct Local Funds grant from the DECD in the amount of \$71,250 part of a \$498,750 distribution to a collaboration of seven art museums in the State. The NBMAA 's Connecticut Arts Endowment Fund grant totaled \$26,722, the highest in the state.

The Art of Wine & Food

"It was the best the world has to offer: good food, fine wine, amazing art and a crowd of about 350 people who were celebrating The Art of Wine & Food at the New Britain Museum of American Art," proclaimed Hartford Courant JAVA reporter Maryellen Fillo.

By all accounts, a fine time was had by all, Tuesday, Sept. 16, 2014. But best yet, the event raised a net \$123,000 for the Museums' programming for families and children, over goal by \$5,000. Trustees John Dillaway and C.J. Joseph served as co-chairs aided by a stellar committee. Farmington Bank again stepped up as Presenting Sponsor. Dozens of well-known restaurants participated including Chef Steve Rosen of the CT Convention Center who presented "Decadent Sweets" to cap off the evening, all complemented by an array of wines and spirits. Vicky Cirilli of Cirilli Associates returned again as Event Director.

Over 400 guests convened Saturday, May 2, 2015 to celebrate the NBMAA's 15th annual Spring Gala, The ART Party of the Year! This year's gala was even more special as it was Douglas Hyland's last gala as Director. Twelve members of his family flew in to attend the event.

We were also pleased to welcome the renowned jewelry artist Elizabeth Gage as our Honorary Chairman. Gage's exhibition, The Enchanting Jewels of Elizabeth Gage, was on view in the McKernan Gallery.

The Gala surpassed its goal, generating net proceeds of over \$206,000 for the Museum's programming for children and families. Sponsorship was strong, led by Platinum Sponsors Signet Jewelers, Stanley Black & Decker and Webster Bank, as was patron support.

Juneteenth is the oldest nationally celebrated commemoration of the ending of slavery in the United States, dating from June 19, 1865 when the news of the Emancipation Proclamation (issued January I, 1863) finally reached Galveston, TX.

This year the NBMAA celebrated the accomplishments of the Civil Rights Movement and honored an unsung hero within the community, Mr. Alton Brooks, who has dedicated his life to battling the war on poverty, the elimination of racial discrimination, and hatred. Brooks is a longtime Community Leader and Activist for the Greater New Britain Community.



MARKETING/PUBLICITY EFFORTS.

While engaging exhibitions and excellent programming drive visitation and participation, a key ingredient to this success is the NBMAA's comprehensive marketing program which spans TV, radio, online, and print advertising and promotion. This year, the Museum worked with L and R Productions of East Hartford to produce new TV spots, the LOOKS commercials, that were well received. The NBMAA partnered with the State Office of Tourism to produce billboards on I84 eastbound and westbound for both the Glass and Quilts exhibitions.

Regular eblasts and a steady social media presence was part of our marketing strategy along with quarterly calendars and 20-page four-color newsletters.
